Fathers Matter in Home Visiting Lessons Learned From Two Promising Programs

Mounting research indicates that children benefit from both mothers' and fathers' positive parenting, and that mothers and fathers can benefit each other as parents. This presentation and discussion will include lessons learned from two promising programs delivered in the context of home visits.

[Dads Matter-HV](#) is a co-parenting enhancement to standard home visiting programs designed to work with mothers and fathers together to strengthen the co-parenting relationship, improve parenting, and reduce maltreatment risk.

[Filming Interactions to Nurture Development](#) (FIND) is a brief home-based program that supports warm and responsive father-child interactions using video recordings to emphasize each fathers' parenting strengths in the context of everyday caretaking moments.
